The Shrine to honor Saint Anne was initially built March 1658, enlarged in 1876. The first was destroyed in a fire in March 1922 and the present day Basilica was built in 1926.

Because of

difficulties during the recession work was resumed in 1937 and it was completed much later in 1946.

The Basilica has a set of nine bells, total weight is 43,087 lbs.

Each bell has a name Angelica, Jesu', Mary, Anne, Joachim, Joseph, John the Baptist, Alphonsus and Patrick.

Quebec City is one of the oldest European settlements in North America French explorer Jacques Cartier built a fort at the site in 1535. Although called the cradle of the Francophone population, the Acadian Settlement at Port-Royal was established 3 years later.

In 1665 there were 550 people in 70 houses in the city.

Quebec City is located on the Saint Lawrence River valley and the Laurentian Mountains lie to the north of the city. It has (35) Districts and (6) Boroughs.  
Population as of 2011 (516,622) the province of Quebec 7,237,479 people.
